# Laws of Chanukah

## *How?*

- One light is kindled on the first evening, and an additional one for each succeeding evening, for eight evenings. The “Shamus” (servant) is not counted as a candle. It is the first candle to be lit and it is used to light the other candles.
- On the first night, set one candle to the far right of the menorah. On the following night, add a second light to the left of the first one, and then add one light each night of Chanukah - moving from right to left.
- Each night, light the newest (left-most) candle first and continue lighting from left to right. (We add lights to the menorah from right to left, while we light from left to right.)
- The Berakhot are sung, followed by Haneiroth Hallalu and Maoz Tzur. On the first night the Shehecheyanu bracha is also recited after the first two brachot.

## *When?*

- There are different opinions in this regard. General advice is to light around “Tzeit Hakochovim,” nightfall, which is approximately 5:13 PM in Lido Beach this time of year.
- The candles must burn for at least 30 minutes after nightfall. Therefore, before kindling the lights it is advisable to ascertain whether there is enough oil, or if candles are used, that they are big enough to last half an hour.
- On Friday, we light candles an hour early due to Shabbos. Please note that “standard” Chanukah candles are made to burn for only half an hour and should not be used on Friday evening for this reason. The Chanukah lights are kindled before the Shabbos candles. On Saturday night, Chanukah lights are kindled after Havdalah.
- The Chanukah lights are also kindled in the Synagogue but they do not excuse one from kindling the Chanukah lights at home.

## *Where?*

- Historically, Chanukah lights were kindled outside of the house. Due to anti-Semitism and other concerns, this custom is no longer practiced. The best place to put the Chanukiah is in a window that faces the public or in any doorway in the house opposite the mezuzah.
- One should light his/her candles in the home where he/she sleeps.

## *Special Questions?*

- **Guest meal:** On any night that one is away from home yet not sleeping at the host’s home, one should wait until returning home to light candles.
- **Friday night:** If eating out there may be concern about leaving the candles unattended. It is best to light candles in one’s own house. If this isn’t possible, one may light at the host’s house.
- **On a weeknight:** After the candles have burned for half an hour (if lit on time, until 5:40 pm) one may blow them out.
- **Dinner:** One is not supposed to eat before lighting candles. However, it is permitted to eat if an alarm is set as a reminder to light after eating.
- **Getting home late:** If one is getting home late during the week, one’s family should wait so that candles may be lit together. If children will not be awake at this time, they should light before. In this case, one should light one’s own Chanukah candles upon arriving home. If arriving home after midnight and everyone is asleep in the house, then the Chanukiah should be lit without reciting the brachot.
- **On a plane:** If one is stuck on a plane or somewhere where it is not possible to light candles, a family member should be appointed to light on one’s behalf.
